New BCHS Wedding Dress Exhibit Opens

The BCHS is pleased to announce the opening of our latest exhbit, "I Do: 140 Years of Butler County Weddings." The exhibit opened on May 1 and will run through September. The exhibit will cover two floors of the Benninghofen House and include twenty wedding dresses ranging from simple dresses to formal gowns dated 1839 to 1973. Also included in the display are three groom suits, wedding accessories, and various wedding photographs all from Butler County.

This is a new an updated version of the wedding exhibit that was conducted in 2015. Conceived and administrated by Dr. Sara Butler, Professor Emerita at Miami University, the exhibit is organized into three components: the artifacts (dresses), the stories of the Butler County familites associated with the artifacts, and the broader historical context. Large display panels placed throughout the exhibit guide the visitor through the historical context. Sara explains, "The historical context is an important aspect of telling the wedding dress story. In the 19th century, women were expected to be delicate and modest. Dress was a visible symbol of a woman's role. The 19th century dresses in the exhibit have a lot of fabric and tiny waists, reflecting role expectations for women."

Family stories that accompany the dresses will also be shared. "Perhaps more interesting to me than the dresses themselves are the stories of the families associated with the dresses," said Sara, "For example, Kitty Symmes was in mourning for her first husband when she married Henry Magie in a black dress. A black wedding dress would be very unusual today."

The wedding dress worn by Mary Woods Falconer in 1839. The veil for this dress was worn by seven descendants, the last in 1990.

On Thursday, May 25 at 7:00 pm in the Emma Richie auditorium, Dr. Butler will make a presentation in conjunction the exhibit. Using examples from the BCHS exhibit, the changing styles of the wedding dresses and the societal factors that influenced those changes will be the focus of the talk. The family stories that accompany the dresses will also be shared.


Sunday, August 27 - "Fun on the Lewis/Sample Farm"


